



- Designs: Protect the shape and appearance of an industrial article
- Patents: Protect underlying principles (inventions)
- Trade Marks: Protect distinguishing signs that are capable of being represented graphically
- Copyright: Protects original works expressed in material form
- Design protection is useful where the shape, configuration or appearance of an article determines its selection for a particular application (*Industrial Designs*)











Designs & patents could cover:





Probably only designs could cover

















- Copyright protection for designs?
 - The copyright in an artistic work of which three-dimensional reproductions were made available to the public (authorised reproductions), shall not be infringed if any person without the consent of the owner makes or makes available to the public three-dimensional reproductions or adaptations of the authorised reproductions, provided the reproductions <u>primarily have a</u> <u>utilitarian purpose and are made by an industrial process</u>.
 - No effective copyright protection for 3-D industrial articles













Two kinds of Designs:

Aesthetic Design

 Any design applied to any article, whether for the pattern or the shape or the configuration or the ornamentation thereof, or for any two or more of those purposes, and by whatever means it is applied, <u>having features which appeal to and are judged solely</u> by the eye, irrespective of the aesthetic quality thereof

Functional Design

 Any design applied to any article, whether for the pattern or the shape or the configuration thereof, or for any two or more of those purposes, and by whatever means it is applied, <u>having</u> <u>features which are necessitated by the function which the article</u> <u>to which the design is applied, is to perform</u>













 - 6 month grace period
- Original/Not Commonplace in the art















Scope of Protection

- Where the measure of novelty of a design is small the ambit of the monopoly is small
 - Clipsal Australia (Pty) Ltd v Trust Electrical Wholesalers [2007] SCA 24 (RSA)













Need applications in each country of interest

6 months

Foreign Design Applications

- SA: Few thousand Rand
- Foreign countries: R20k to R25k













- SA Aesthetic Designs
 - 15 Years
- SA Functional Designs
 - 10 Years













- Relatively low cost
- Quick to be granted
- Easily enforceable prevents direct copying



- Licensing opportunities
- Protecting your market share
- Guarding against counterfeit products
